SUMMER IS HERE

Summer is finally here, and we are so excited to spend more time outside enjoying our wonderful neighborhood. We have already begun making some landscape updates to prep for the upcoming hot and humid months. Just like every summer season, the POA office switches our usual lawn care schedule to a summer schedule with more frequent cuttings. With the warm months ahead, the grass grows quickly and needs to be maintained more often. For empty lot owners, the POA offers grass cutting at a very reasonable rate. The office also has many recommendations for lawn services for both lot and residential lawns.

Along with the lawn maintenance, our groundskeepers have also been busy removing diseased hedges, Indian Hawthorns, from the community in common areas between many streets. We recently learned that Indian hawthorns last approximately 25 years before becoming dormant. With the community being just about that age, it was clear they needed to be replaced. We are replacing any that did not return at this point in the season with distylium, a similar shrub that does not grow as tall and is more dense—perfect for the medians.

They are also, unlike the hawthorns, insect-resistant, which should help with the mosquitos that join us each summer. If you have any shrubs that did not grow back yet, you may also have dormant Indian hawthorns that will need to be removed. Give us a call at the office if you need any recommendations for removal.

We also recently paid to have our parkway walls and sign cleaned up in a continued effort to prep for the summer months. Due to the severity of the current wall state, the Board has approved additional planting of creeping ivy, which will eventually fill out and cover the entire length of the Parkway wall. This decision was made after weighing the cost of future cleaning and painting versus the cost of trimming the ivy. Over the long haul, this will save the POA thousands of dollars.

With many compliance inspections coming this season, residents should also be wary of algae issues on their exterior walls with the hot and humid months coming up. We recommend scheduling a power washing service if needed to avoid a citation. We recommend Renew Pressure Washing Services, LLC (504) 814-9121, Pretty Clean Soft Wash (504) 882-3224, and Steve's Pressure Washing (504) 392-9408.



CRAWFISH BOIL

When recounting the event's pros and cons, Margeaux was delighted to say they will double the amount of crawfish they have next year—600 pounds would be our next goal. She would also like to start a new tradition of live crawfish racing with a neat interactive table for a few live crawfish—this would be such a great activity with the kids. We also would like to implement two different serving times within the tickets; some tickets would be for the noon serving and the rest for a 2 o'clock serving.

We also plan to implement a stricter RSVP policy for the next crawfish boil, as no walk-ins will be allowed. To ensure this we hope to send more email reminders before the deadline occurs.

The City's Department of Sanitation only offers a Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Materials Collection Day twice a year. It will be held at 2829 Elysian Fields Ave from 8am to 1pm. Items must be separated from regular recycling in categories such as paint, flammables, chemicals, aerosols, batteries, light bulbs, and pesticides. **Resident Mary Balyeat is taking up a collection of batteries to deliver to the recycling center on the 14th. There is a bin on the porch of the POA building for battery collection.**
